**A note from the Pastor*****Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,***

**T**oday's Gospel reading tells us that many followed Jesus who had been cured from evil spirits and infirmities. Among them was Mary, called Magdalene, "from whom seven demons had gone out." It's a reminder to us of the existence of the one who causes, at all places and times, all the trouble we see and experience around us, namely, the *devil*.

Whenever we are tempted to pass judgment on someone, in the face of disagreements, wrongdoings, sins (and how many do we all commit!) we should remind ourselves that the true origin of all division, lack of communion, arguments ... is the *devil*! Demons are around us constantly trying to destroy any good we are attempting to do, particularly when we act in the name of the Lord, for the sake of the Church and the benefit of others. The main work of the *devil* is two-fold: on the one hand he tries to convince us that he doesn't exist; on the other hand he wants us to adhere to little factions in order to strengthen in each one of us a feeling of righteousness and superiority.

In his *Screwtape Letters* (one of my favorite readings) C. S. Lewis wonderfully describes the work of the devil, as I have summarized it, in the words uncle demon writes to his nephew: "*I wonder you should ask me whether it is essential to keep the [person you are tempting] in ignorance of your own existence. ... Our policy, for the moment, is to conceal ourselves. Of course this has not always been so. We are really faced with a cruel dilemma. When the humans disbelieve in our existence we lose all the pleasing results of direct terrorism and we make no magicians. On the other hand, when they believe in us, we cannot make them materialists and skeptics. ...*

*I do not think you will have much difficulty in keeping the [person you are tempting] in the dark. The fact that 'devils' are predominantly comic figures in the modern imagination will help you. If any faint suspicion of your existence begins to arise in his mind, suggest to him a picture of something in red tights, and persuade him that since he cannot believe in that ... he cannot believe in you.*

*We want the Church to be small not only that fewer men may know the Enemy but also that those who do may acquire the uneasy intensity and the defensive self-righteousness of a secret society or a clique. The Church herself is, of course, heavily defended and we have never yet quite succeeding giving her all the characteristics of a faction; but subordinate factions within her have often produced admirable results...."*

I believe it's time for *all* of us to learn how to resist the temptation to point fingers at others and realize that the *devil* is the one who is actually willing to destroy and divide. Rather than shooting at our neighbor, let us acknowledge the shameful work of the one who, even here at our place, wants to demolish what we try to build, the one to be blamed first and foremost, who so easily deceives and generate confusion in so many people.

This will be located in the Assumption ECC and is totally wheelchair accessible.**

Five screenings will be offered that scan for potential health problems related to: blocked arteries which is a leading cause of stroke; abdominal aortic aneurysms which can lead to a ruptured aorta; hardening of the arteries in the legs which is a strong predictor of heart disease; atrial fibrillation or irregular heart beat which is closely tied to stroke risk, and a bone density screening for men and women, used to assess the risk of osteoporosis.
